The Guides and Scouts of Sweden

Scouting in Sweden is a vibrant, co-educational movement that brings together more than 80,000 members across the country. Formed through the unification of several historical Scout and Guide associations, **Scouterna** embodies a modern, inclusive, and forward-looking expression of Baden-Powell's vision.

Founded in the early 1900s, Swedish Scouting has evolved in close harmony with the nation's deep respect for **nature**, **democracy**, **and equality**. Its activities are guided by the Scout Method — learning by doing, leading, reflecting, and growing together. Today, Scouterna continues to empower young people to make a difference in their communities and to become young people who make the world a better place.

Thousands of volunteer leaders guide local Scout troops across Sweden, in cities, small towns, and throughout the vast countryside, supporting the youngest Spårare (8–9 years) to Rovers (19–25 years). Swedish Scouts are renowned for their strong environmental commitment, adventure-based learning, and leadership training rooted in **friluftsliv** — **outdoor life** — a cornerstone of Swedish culture. From winter expeditions in Lapland to sailing among the archipelago islands, their activities reflect both challenge and care for nature.

Scouterna's national headquarters are based in Stockholm, home to its leadership, training centre, and **Scouternas folkhögskola** — the national school for Scouting and leadership education. This vibrant hub offers programmes that promote sustainability, inclusion, and civic engagement.

During our 78th BP Fellowship Event, participants will have the opportunity to meet Swedish Scouts and leaders, explore their innovative approaches to youth development and sustainability, and experience the "Simply Scouting" spirit that continues to make Scouting in Sweden a global inspiration.



8 MAY Stockholm Tour Old Town, Stockholm

Take the opportunity to see both **the Royal Palace** and **the Old Town**, on a walking tour through the foundations of the city of Stockholm.

In the Old Town you will get a feel for 800 years of life on the central island of Stockholm. Most of the buildings represent the 17th century, still the city plan originates from the Middle Ages between 13th and 16th centuries. The small alleys and cobbled stone streets have many stories to tell.

The highlight of the tour will be a visit to the Royal Palace of Stockholm. This is the workplace of HM The King of Sweden, where he receives honoured guests such as new ambassadors, Nobel Prize laureates, and receivers of royal orders. In the palace, the King has regular meetings with the government and parliamentarians. Constructed in the 18th century, the palace is one of the largest in Europe with more than 1,300 rooms. The interiors and art collection includes traces from history and gifts from states and nations of the world, mainly Europe. Please be prepared for an active tour involving many cobblestone paths, hills and staircases.

Dress code: Casual, with comfortable footwear for walking.

For those for whom the walking tour is not suitable, we offer a guided tour by bus (limited walking) where you will see a number of classical landmarks in Stockholm — the city on water.

8 MAY Seminar "A Peaceful and Inclusive World"

The Filadelfia Conference Centre

Join a unique seminar that brings together leaders and changemakers from around the world to reflect on one of the most important questions of our time: How can inclusive leadership create peace and thriving societies?

In the presence of HM The King of Sweden, the seminar will offer an intimate space for dialogue and reflection, where listening and exchange are central. Participants will hear from world-class speakers — spanning business, politics, culture, and the next generation — and share an experience designed to spark new perspectives and deeper understanding.

The seminar will be anchored in the values of Scouting, an organisation dedicated to peace, inclusion, and preparing young people to be citizens of the world. These values form the foundation of this seminar, offering participants an experience that is both personal and shared: a rare opportunity to explore leadership that brings people together for the greater good.

In a reflective and thoughtful atmosphere, the seminar will also invite active engagement. Inspiring presentations will be combined with facilitated dialogue, creating the possibility to listen, exchange, reflect and learn together. Participants will leave with a deeper appreciation of inclusion as a leadership strength, a network of like-minded leaders and changemakers, and perspectives that will continue to shape their leadership long after the seminar ends.

Participants will have the chance to join in the activities and meet Swedish Scouts of all ages, experiencing firsthand the energy, skills, and camaraderie that define Scouting in Sweden.

Dress code: Scout uniform or casual with a scarf. Dress for the weather — you will be outside!






9 MAY 78th Baden-Powell Fellowship Gala Dinner Stockholm City Hall

Dress code: Black tie




10 MAY Departures

7 May Pre-Event Tours



TOUR 1 The Vasa Museum ABBA The Museum

Join us for a full day tour where we will visit two of the main attractions at Royal Djurgården, each of them representing two very different aspects of Swedish history and culture. We will visit the Vasa Museum and ABBA The Museum. The tour will include lunch between the two museum visits.

The Vasa Museum is the most visited tourist destination in Scandinavia. In 1628 the greatest warship in the Baltic Sea sank on its maiden voyage after a few hundred meters sailing in the port of Stockholm. Fort 333 years it was waiting at the bottom of the sea for its rescue in 1961. In the museum the ship is at full display in almost the same greatness as on the fateful day in August 1628.

The four members of the pop group ABBA started creating music in the 1960s. In the museum you will join this legendary group on their journey from young musicians up until today's avatar experience in London. You will have an interactive experience where you can sing and perform your dance with ABBA on the stage. The collections on display include their stage dresses, iconic instruments, selected stage props and others. The museum's slogan is "you walk in and dance out".



TOUR 3

Drottningholm Palace

Join us for an excursion to Drottningholm Palace, the home of HM The King of Sweden. The tour will include lunch between visiting the palace and the gardens.

Drottningholm Palace was commissioned by four Swedish queens representing different eras. Queen Katarina Jagellonica in the 16th century started the building of a palace on the property. The central part of the building was made by Queen Hedvig Eleonora in the second half of the 17th century. She also commissioned the baroque part of the beautiful park. Queen Lovisa Ulrika continued the expansion in the middle of the 18th century with the rococo wings. She also built the famous Drottningholm theatre, which still hosts popular opera performances, and the English park section in the gardens.

Finally, Queen Josefina made the impressive interior of the palace's hall of state, reflecting the political landscape in the middle of the 19th century. The art in the palace represents the different eras of the palace itself. The tour combines a beautiful nature experience, an insight into 500 years of European art and architectural history, and an understanding of why today's King and Queen of Sweden have chosen to make Drottningholm their residential home.

Event Programme for Young BP Fellows

We greatly value your commitment to World Scouting and are excited to invite you to the 78th BP Fellowship Event in Stockholm!

As part of this event, we are pleased to once again offer a special programme for up to **25 Young BP Fellows** (aged 18 to 35 at the time of the event) to participate at a subsidised rate of 6,000 SEK.

Young BP Fellows joining this programme will take part in all the main event activities, with some special additions: on Thursday 7 May you will be meeting up with local Rover Scouts for dinner and an activity and on 8 May you will take part in a local Scouting event.

Accommodation will be provided in shared rooms at a Youth Hostel on Skeppsholmen, a historic area in central Stockholm.

The programme fee covers:

- Shared accommodation from Thursday, 7 May, to Sunday, 10 May 2026
- All meals from Thursday evening, 7 May, to Sunday breakfast, 10 May
- Local transport during the event

The fee does not include transportation to and from Stockholm, nor personal insurance, which must be arranged individually, in line with the requirements for all participants.

Practicalities

Registration

Please register via the individual link communicated via email. Please note that the personalised event registration links will be sent to BP Fellow primary contacts for households, as usual, to ensure that we can correctly identify and link registrations, avoiding duplicates.

The primary contact can register themselves and up to two accompanying persons (a partner or spouse, and/or an immediate family member or guest — including those who are BP Fellows in your household), subject to availability.

To do this, once you have entered all of your own information and reached the registration summary page, you can click on "Add an accompanying person" and register up to two additional accompanying persons (subject to availability) via the same process, ahead of payment.

Detailed information on the registration process is being communicated to BP Fellows in advance of the registration system opening.

We are expecting very high interest in this event and advise you to register immediately to secure your place. The cut-off date for registrations will be 31 March 2026 or as soon as we reach full capacity.

Insurance & Cancellation

We strongly advise you to purchase all appropriate insurance (travel, accommodation costs, etc.) in case of cancellation. Please note that if the event is cancelled, the Foundation will reimburse your registration fee in full.

If you cancel your participation up to and including 15 January, we will refund 50% of the fees (programme and any additional activities). We will no longer provide a refund for cancellations on or after 16 January.

You are responsible for ensuring that you have the appropriate accident and medical insurance for your travel and stay in Sweden. Please also check the latest information and advice regarding necessary vaccinations and traveller's health.

Visas

Citizens from some countries will require a visa to enter Sweden. Please ensure you check the visa requirements (https://visitsweden.com/about-sweden/passport-and-visas/) and should you need a visa support letter to attend our event, please contact the team.

Transportation

Please make your own transportation arrangements from your point of arrival in Stockholm to your selected accommodation, as well as for the return trip, departing from your hotel.

Stockholm Arlanda Airport (ARN) is the international airport serving Stockholm. There is another airport Bromma Stockholm Airport for domestic flights and some international routes.

If you wish to arrange an airport transfer, please contact your hotel's concierge services directly to arrange this at your own cost.

Another option would be to take the Arlanda Express train (www.arlandaexpress.se) from Arlanda to Stockholm Central Station, which takes around 18 minutes. From Stockholm Central Station, you can then hail a taxi to reach central hotels.

Other options from Arlanda are taxi, commuter train or bus.

During the event

We will arrange transportation from our main hotel "event hub" to the main activity venues and back during our event. Participants staying at alternative venues must ensure that they arrive at our main hotel in time for departures. We will share the specific timings closer to the event.

Come Prepared!

May in Stockholm is a magical time: spring is in bloom, daylight lingers late into the evening, and the city reveals itself with renewed elegance and vitality. It is the ideal month for visitors who appreciate a balance of culture, nature, and refined experiences.

Weather & Ambience

By May, Stockholm sheds it's winter coat. Temperatures steadily climb towards 15-20°C during the day, though evenings may still carry a crispness. The weather can be cool and rainy. Daylight spans up to 17 hours, bathing the city in soft, golden light that perfectly frames its architecture and waterfronts. With parks, gardens, and treelined boulevards erupting in green, it's a time when locals emerge outdoors, and terraces, cafés and rooftop bars reopen.

What to pack

Layers are key. Early mornings and evenings can be cool, while midday sun can be warm. A light coat, a scarf, perhaps a stylish umbrella in case of spring showers. Please ensure you bring closed shoes for the Scout Activity and suitable walking footwear for the tours and other activities.
